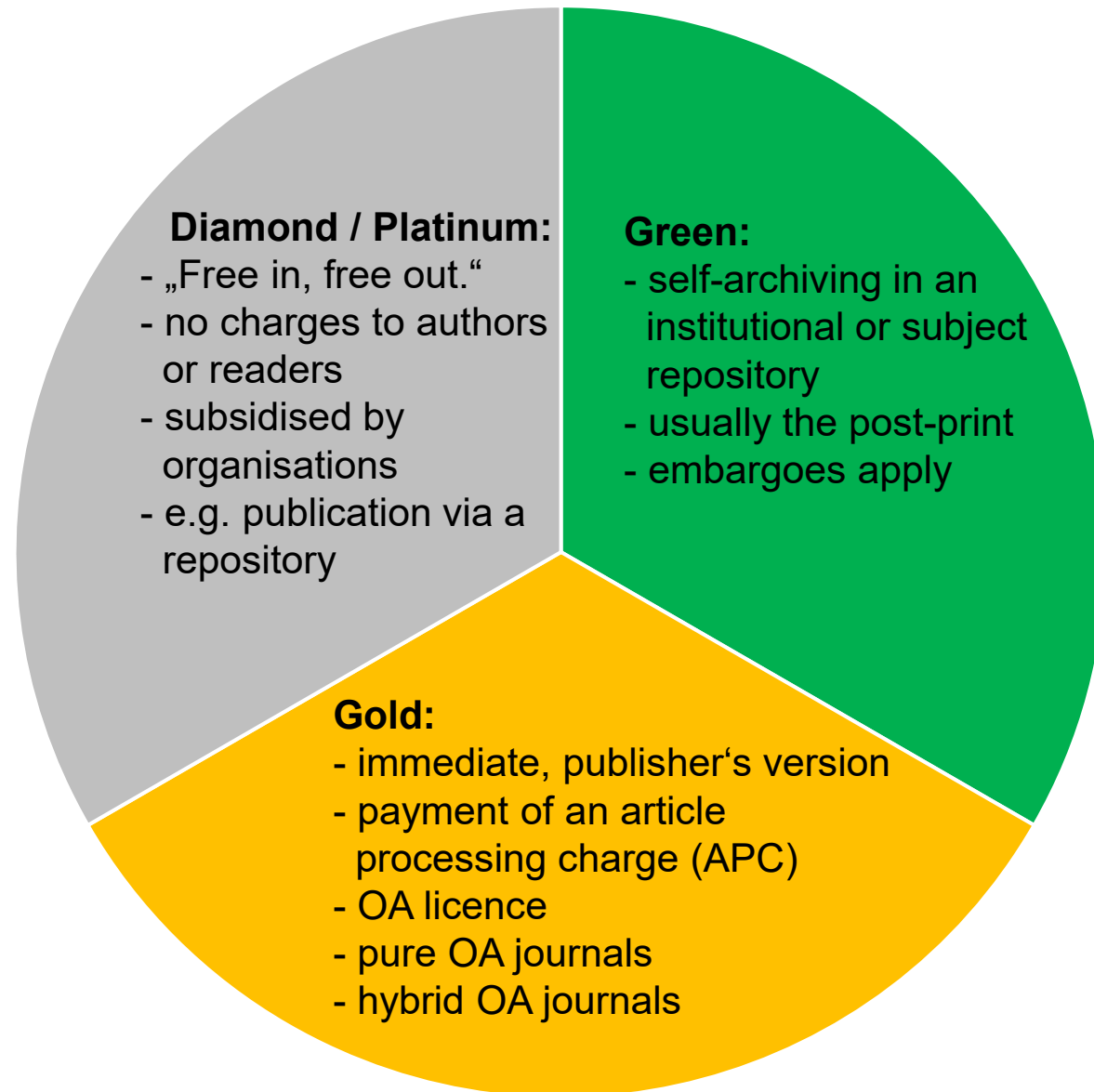
What is Open Access?

“By “open access” to [peer-reviewed research literature], we mean its **free** availability on the **public** internet, permitting any users to **read, download, copy, distribute, print**, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, pass them as data to software, or **use** them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet itself.”

Overview: the three most common Open Access colours



Open Access licences



- Creative Commons = CC
 - BY= Attribution
 - NC= NonCommercial
 - ND= NoDerivatives
 - SA= ShareAlike
- Combination of attributes creates 6 standard licences
- Options vary by journal
- CC-BY required by some funders

Open Access licences – how do I best share my research?



⌚ journal articles, widest possible distribution and reuse, meets funder requirements: CC-BY

⌚ books / edited volumes: CC-BY-NC or CC-BY-SA, to avoid commercial reuse

Open Access licences – what to watch out for



- ⌚ BEWARE: respect any third party rights in your paper (pictures, graphics, charts...)
- ⌚ some publishers have their own Open Access licences („author choice“, „open licence“) – conditions vary hugely
- ⌚ free of charge on the publisher's website **≠** reuse, distribution etc. allowed

OA publishing: diamond

- Publishing via our institutional repository (OPUS), e.g. dissertations, series, working papers, reports ... (<https://opus.bibliothek.uni-augsburg.de/>)
- BoD cooperation



OA publishing: gold

- Publisher agreements
- DEAL with Elsevier, Wiley and Springer
- Subsidies via „young researchers“ fund and funding for the advancement of women



OA publishing: green

- Self-archiving service, incl. rights checks, publisher enquiries and scan service



OA publishing

- Publication lists, incl. plugin for the website (individuals and research groups)
- Guidance & support covering journals, contracts, licences ...
