What is Open Access?

"By "open access" to [peer-reviewed research literature], we mean its **free** availability on the **public** internet, permitting any users to **read**, **download**, **copy**, **distribute**, **print**, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, pass them as data to software, or **use** them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet itself."

Overview: the three most common Open Access colours

Diamond / Platinum:

- "Free in, free out."
- no charges to authors or readers
- subsidised by organisations
- e.g. publication via a repository

Green:

- self-archiving in an institutional or subject repository
- usually the post-print
- embargoes apply

Gold:

- immediate, publisher's version
- payment of an article processing charge (APC)
- OA licence
- pure OA journals
- hybrid OA journals






Making your publications more visible: self-archiving (green OA)

Various options:

- subject repositories
- academic networks (e.g. ResearchGate)
- institutional repositories
- own website



Important:

- check your rights (or have them checked) e.g. via SherpaRomeo: https://v2.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/
- avoid signing away your rights to commercial platforms
- suggestion: instead, upload full text onto non-commercial platform, then link to it





Self-archiving service: enriching publication lists with full text



- 1. Interested in our self-archiving service? Email openaccess@bibliothek.uni-augsburg.de
- 2. Library checks self-archiving rights
- 3. Results are sent to author
- 4. Author signs "Zustimmungserklärung" (permission to upload full texts)
- 5. Full text files are made available via OPUS for publications chosen by author
- 6. If rights are unclear, library contacts publishers for permission





Self-archiving service: enriching publication lists with full text





- records in OPUS have URNs (stable long-term, ideal for linking and referencing)
- full text is archived in German National Library
- publications are indexed by search engines etc.
- if Django CMS publication list plugin is used, a direct download link automatically appears on the website

 Publishing via our institutional repository (OPUS), e.g. dissertations, series, working papers, reports ... (https://opus.bibliothek.uni-augsburg.de/)



OA publishing: gold

- Publisher agreements
- DEAL with Wiley and Springer
- PubliQation
- Subsidies via DFG, "young researchers" fund and funding for the advancement of women



OA publishing: green

Self-archiving service, incl. rights checks, publisher enquiries and scan service
