

Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. Michael Kubiciel

Michael Kubiciel is a criminal law professor at the University of Augsburg. From 2012 to 2017, he was a professor at the University of Cologne. Previously, he worked as an assistant professor at the University of Regensburg and senior researcher at the Max Planck Institute for International Criminal Law in Freiburg. He publishes both on fundamental questions of criminal law (criminal law theory, history of ideas and constitutional principles) as well as on current problems, namely in the field of anti-corruption law, corporate crime and medical criminal law. He regularly acts as an expert for the German Bundestag on criminal policy issues. In the last two years he has twice represented parliamentary groups of the German Bundestag as a legal representative before the Federal Constitutional Court. Between 2002 and 2018 he worked as a counsel for the CoE (GRECO), the UNODC and the DG HOME (European Commission) in connection with international anti-corruption law policies. He is a co-editor of the “Commentary of the UN Convention Against Corruption” published by Oxford University Press and frequently publishes op-eds in newspapers such as the “Frankfurter Allgemeine”.
