#### Recyclables collection - we come and collect!

#### Bulky waste

Wardrobes, chairs, tables, upholstered furniture, Mattresses, mirrors, other household goods, etc.

#### Scrap metal

Bicycles, sinks, metal parts, oil-fired stoves, etc.

#### Electrical equipment

Refrigerating equipment, freezers, cookers, washing machines, televisions, PCs, notebooks, radios, cameras, vacuum cleaners, etc.

#### Plant waste

Garden waste, which you cannot compost yourself or cannot be collected in the organic waste collection bin

Please arrange an time and date for collection. Collection is free of charge.

#### Recycling points - recycling banks all around the city!

#### **Bottle banks**

Bottles, glass jars with screw tops, caps, and also corks

#### Old clothing

Only well kept, usable old textiles Place material scraps and rags in the grey bin

#### Small electrical appliances

These can be taken to selected locations (for example, mobile phones, irons, cameras (up to the size of a computer)).

Legal use times: workdays from 07:00 - 12:00 and 14:00 - 20:00.




- clean paper and cardboard packaging (including those symbol)


#### Loose, compostable wastes:

#### garden waste, for example

- potting compost
- grass cuttings, straw
- green and rotting fruit
- plant remains and weeds
- chopped up shrub cuttings
- cut flowers

#### Kitchen waste, e.g.

- raw fruit and vegetable waste
- fruit peel, nut and egg shells
- · coffee and tea filters and their contents
- · paper kitchen towels for wrapping up damp waste





#### For example:

- plastic bags, packaging netting
- fish, meat and sausage meat leftovers
- bones
- cooked food
- nappies
- · vacuum cleaner bags
- pet sand, ashes, sweepings
- paper and cardboard, such as newspapers, books, cardboard boxes
- paints, varnishes
- solvents
- medicines
- batteries
- cleaning products



#### Paper and cardboard

- · with and without the green dot recycling symbol
- in the largest possible pieces
- as clean as possible
- · please fold cardboard boxes

#### for example

- newspapers, magazines
- brochures, catalogues, school exercise books
- wrapping paper, cardboard packs, cartons, cardboard boxes...
- books





#### For example:

- carbon paper, blue or black
- tissue paper such as paper tissues and nappies
- soiled or wet paper
- wallpaper
- empty cement sacks
- coated paper, e.g. mixed packaging such as juice or milk cartons
- parchment, tracing and greaseproof paper
- files...



Residual waste, which cannot be recycled, for example:

- food waste (cooked) and bones
- hygiene product waste, such as panty liners, nappies
- · ceramics, porcelain, mirrors, light bulbs
- cold ashes
- soiled, wet paper
- wallpaper, carpeting remains or off-cuts
- children's toys
- audio and video cassettes
- old medicines





- energy-saving lamps
- fluorescent tubes
- building rubble
- old electrical equipment/appliances

and everything, which belongs

- in the yellow bin
- in the green bin
- in the brown bin
- · which must be handed over as hazardous waste
- · which is to be taken to the recycling depot
- in the waste glass/bottle banks
- · in the old clothes collection banks
