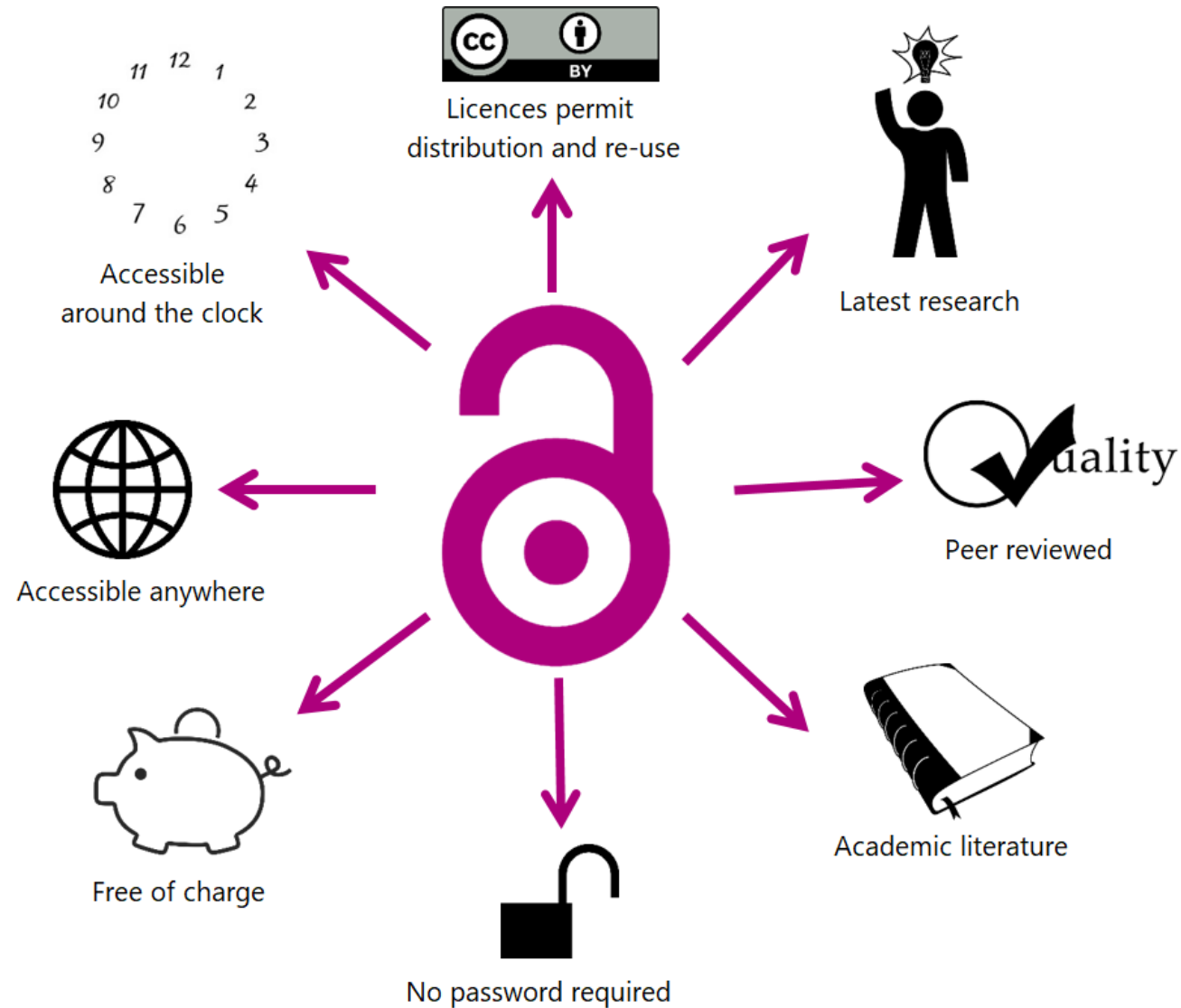
What is Open Access?

“By “open access” to [peer-reviewed research literature], we mean its **free** availability on the **public** internet, permitting any users to **read, download, copy, distribute, print**, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, pass them as data to software, or **use** them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the internet itself.”

What should I look out for?

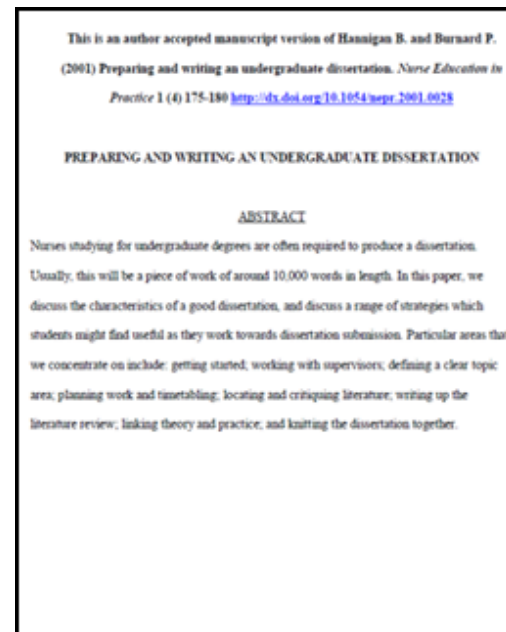


- Fulltext version (Final version? Page numbers?)
- Licence for reuse
- Link for the bibliography (URN? DOI?)
- Source (Quality?)

Which versions of a journal article exist?

Preprint	Draft. Submitted version of a research article, prior to peer review.
Postprint	Accepted Manuscript (AAM). Final, corrected and peer reviewed version of the article, without the publisher's branding. Often without page numbers (or starting at 1).
Final version	Proofs; Version of Record (VoR). The type-set and formatted version of the article as it appears online or in the print journal (including the proofs).

OA publishing: diamond

- Publishing via our institutional repository (OPUS), e.g. dissertations, series, working papers, reports ... (<https://opus.bibliothek.uni-augsburg.de/>)



OA publishing: gold

- Publisher agreements
- DEAL with Wiley and Springer
- PubliQation
- Subsidies via DFG, „young researchers“ fund and funding for the advancement of women



OA publishing: green

- Self-archiving service, incl. rights checks, publisher enquiries and scan service



OA publishing

- Publication lists, incl. plugin for the website (individuals and research groups)
- Guidance & support covering journals, contracts, licences ...



Open Access Myth? Busted!

Open Access is already much more widespread than you might think and quite often you can also access final, published versions online (e.g. due to publisher permissions or the German self-archiving law).

There are no Open Access publications in my research area and in repositories you can only find preprints.
