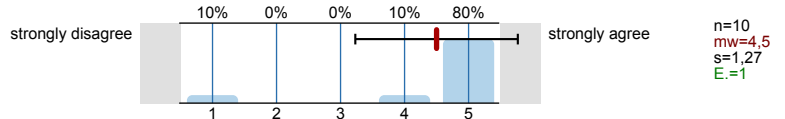


E-Learning

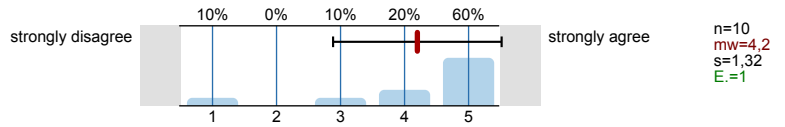

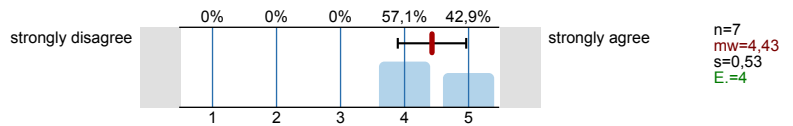
Offering live sessions (e.g. via Zoom, Microsoft Teams, etc.) are useful for understanding the course content.



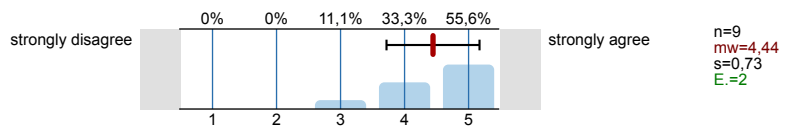

How often do you have technical problems during the course (e.g. no internet connection, program did not work, course recordings could not be played)?

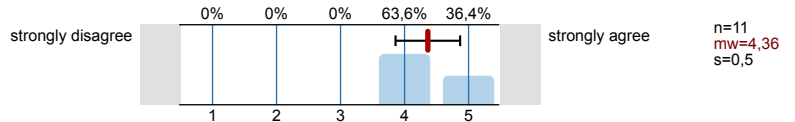
