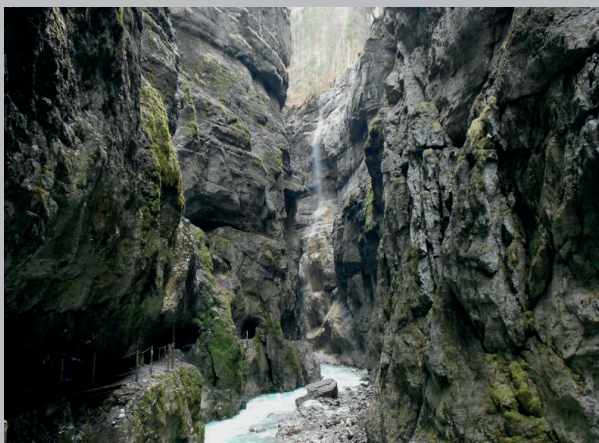


## Munich

### City Tour & Museum Visit

## Partnachklamm

### Nature Hike & Adventure

Saturday, May 25, 2019

The Partnachklamm is a natural gorge, which was designated a natural monument in 1912, near the city of Garmisch-Partenkirchen. It was formed in the Triassic, approx. 240 million years ago, is around 700m long and, in some places, more than 80m deep. We will not only hike through the gorge, but also explore the surrounding area and enjoy the stunning panorama of the Alps. Our lunch will take place at a traditional lodge-style restaurant. This trip is a wonderful way to spend a spring day out and about in southern Bavaria.



## Regensburg

### City Tour & Boat Ride

Saturday, June 29, 2019

The city of Regensburg is picturesquely located along the shores of the river Danube. Its medieval city center is World Heritage-listed and offers many sights we will explore during a guided tour. The emblem of the city is the Stone Bridge, which is a true masterwork of medieval construction.
