

General Doctoral Regulations - §30 Publication of the thesis

[unofficial translation]

- 40 printed copies have to be delivered to the University Library free of charge.
- If the thesis is published in a journal or a commercial publisher takes on the distribution via book shops (minimum edition: 150 copies), only 6 printed copies have to be delivered.
- Faculty doctoral regulations can allow for the distribution via a print on demand publisher and stipulate the conditions for availability.
- Faculty doctoral regulations can allow an electronic version (plus 4 mandatory printed copies) to be handed in instead and can stipulate the conditions.
- Faculty doctoral regulations can regulate the publication and printed version in more detail.









4 routes to the publication of your thesis

- 1. print copies straight from the copyshop
- 2. online publication in OPUS
- 3. publication with a publisher (print and/or Open Access)
- 4. online dissertation with print on demand via OPUS & PubliQation







1. Print copies straight from the copyshop

- After the successful viva, 40 copies are printed and handed in at the faculty office.
- The faculty passes the copies on to the library.
- The thesis is indexed in the university bibliography and the library catalogue.







2. Online publication in OPUS

- After the successful viva, a PDF is uploaded to OPUS (https://opus.bibliothek.uni-augsburg.de/opus4/publish).
- The library checks the PDF and passes the details on to the faculty.
- The faculty approves the printing of the mandatory bound copies.
- After that, 4 copies are printed and bound and handed in at the faculty office.
- The faculty passes the copies on to the library.
- A non-exclusive publishing contract is signed.
- The thesis is published via OPUS, indexed in the library catalogue and archived in the German National Library long-term.







3. Publication with a publisher (print and/or Open Access)

- After the successful viva, the thesis is published with a publishing house. Either:
 - as a printed / electronic monograph or
 - as an Open Access title
- 6 copies are handed in at the faculty office.
- The faculty passes the copies on to the library.
- The thesis is indexed in the university bibliography (if OA with full text) and the library catalogue.







4. Online dissertation via OPUS & print on demand via PubliQation

- 4-6 mandatory print copies to be handed in (depending on faculty)
- OA publication in the institutional repository, OPUS
- cooperation with an external partner, PubliQation additional services at discounted rates, such as
 - layout, design & copy editing
 - ebook formats
 - print on demand ebook with ISBN for online book shops
 - own set of print copies

Cumulative theses and author rights for publication

Three routes:

- 1. Papers are only listed, but not integrated into published thesis.
- Papers are integrated into published thesis in their final, published versions.
- 3. Papers are integrated into published thesis in their accepted manuscript versions.



- Open Access articles are no problem, but potentially differing licences have to be accommodated and declared in final, complete thesis.
- Self-archiving rights vary hugely, depending on the publishers involved (embargo periods, versions etc.)
- An important tool is the "Sherpa Romeo" database, in which you can check publishers' policies: https://v2.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/





What is the DEAL? Which other publisher agreements exist for Open Access at Augsburg University?

- Wiley and Springer DEAL
 - articles in hybrid journals can be published Open Access free of charge
 - articles in fully gold journals can be published Open Access with a 20% discount

- publishing costs need to be covered by the author or research group (subsidies may be available)

OA publishing: diamond

 Publishing via our institutional repository (OPUS), e.g. dissertations, series, working papers, reports ... (https://opus.bibliothek.uni-augsburg.de/)



OA publishing: gold

- Publisher agreements
- DEAL with Wiley and Springer
- PubliQation
- Subsidies via DFG, "young researchers" fund and funding for the advancement of women



OA publishing: green

Self-archiving service, incl. rights checks, publisher enquiries and scan service



OA publishing

- Publication lists, incl. plugin for the website (individuals and research groups)
- Guidance & support covering journals, contracts, licences ...
