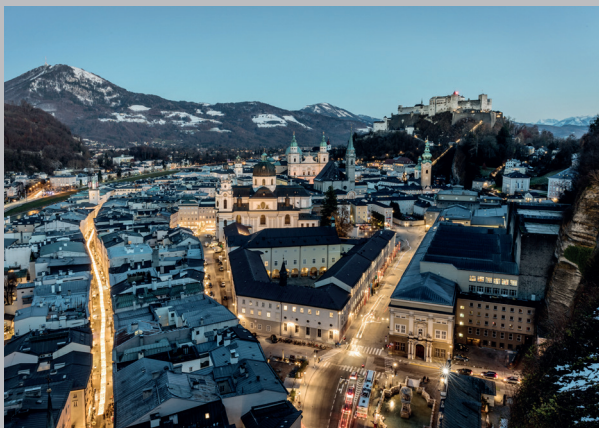


## Neuschwanstein Castle

### Castle Tour & City Sightseeing

October 27, 2018

A research stay in Augsburg just would not be complete without a trip deep into the rural region of Allgäu to tour the legendary, mystic Neuschwanstein Castle, one of Germany’s most famous attractions. It was built in the authentic style of the old German knights’ castles beginning in 1869 for King Ludwig II of Bavaria as a retreat and in honor of the composer Richard Wagner. You will also have the chance to enjoy Bavarian food, explore the surrounding area, including the stunning lake Alpsee, and visit the charming city of Füssen.
